









Summer school "Economic, social and cultural rights of migrant children in the European Union"

Jean Monnet Module MARS Online training course 22-24 & 27-30 June 2022

Who can apply

The Summer School is designed for professionals (such as public officers, lawyers, consultants, legal operators, social workers, guardians); academics, Ph.D. students and students with a general knowledge of the matter and intending to upgrade their knowledge and competences.



Learning objectives

Participants will acquire:

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- an advanced insight on the international and EU law on migrant children's rights;
- a practical and immediately applicable knowledge on the economic, social, cultural rights of migrant children;
- in-depth knowledge of the EU Pact on Migration and Asylum, the EU Strategy on the Rights of the Child, the Child Guarantee and the Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2022-2027) will be discussed providing participants with all the relevant teaching materials (regulations, case-law, reports, etc.).

Aims

The Summer School offers specific expertise on the **economic**, **social and cultural rights of migrant children**.

This course endorses a strong interdisciplinary approach to migration and focuses on the jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights and the Court of Justice of the European Union as well as on the current challenges for the protection of migrant children's rights.



Sessions

The **first session (22-24 June 2022)** provides a strong **theoretical** understanding of the socio-economic and cultural rights of migrant children in international and EU law, including a focus on the right to development and migrant children's health, social assistance and housing.

The second session (27-30 June 2022) provides practical knowledge and expertise of the socio-economic and cultural rights of migrant children, focusing on migrant children's vulnerability, social and economic discrimination, prohibition of labour exploitation, trafficking and smuggling and migrant children's right to education and religion.

Work plan

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The Course will be held online for a total amount of 40 hours of training. Each day is composed of 6 hours of lessons (9:00-13:00 and 14:00-16:00), except for the last day that is composed of 4 hours of lessons (9:00-13:00). Case studies sessions and Q&A sessions are planned in order to stimulate the exchanges between trainers and trainees, promoting the creation of a network among all participants. At the end of the Course participants will received certificate of attendance and the acknowledgement of 2 European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)





APPLICATION

The enrolment application is to be received by **13**th **June 2022** and is to be submitted exclusively online by registering at this <u>link</u>. The Course tuition fee amounts to € **200** and includes the attendance of all lectures and the teaching material.

For those who have already attended previous training courses organized by the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna in the framework of the Jean Monnet Module MARS, the fee amounts to € 150. In any case, an early bird discount is reserved to candidates applying **before 31st May 2022**. For early birds, the course fee is € 150.

Moreover, there is an **exemption** from enrolment fees for **No. 7 foreign students who are international protection holders**, in consideration of the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies adhesion to the **UNHCR Manifesto of Inclusive University**. The exemption will be granted on the basis of the chronological order of registration.
